STRUCTURED ABSTRACT GUIDELINES

All papers must adhere to the following formatting:

- Papers should be original and not currently under review at another venue.
- To help ensure correct formatting, please use the Kautz Conference Structured Abstract Template for your submission.

- Only papers in .DOT, .DOC or .DOCX format will be accepted.
- Paper Size: A4 (210mm x 297mm).
- Formatting and length: The text body is in Times New Roman font style 11 pt; 1.15 line spacing, .DOT, .DOC or .DOCX format. Chapter headings are bold. The abstract should be a minimum of 400 words and a maximum of 500 words.
- New authors cannot be added after the submission deadline.
- Content of the Structured abstract:

Title: the title of the abstract should clearly reflect the content, be concise and informative.

Authors and affiliation: include the authors' names, affiliation, including university/research institution (faculty/department), country and city, ORCID (every author must provide ORCID ID, for details see: https://orcid.org/signin) and email address.

Background and introduction: briefly describe the background to the research and the purpose of the study. This may include research questions or hypotheses. Objective: briefly describe the aim of the research.

Methodology: describe the research design, the groups studied, the methods and instruments used.

Results: summarize the main findings, supported by data and statistics. Indicate the relevant results without going into too much detail.

Conclusions: present the main findings and conclusions of the research. This may include the significance of the research, theoretical and practical findings.

Limitations and future research directions: describe the limitations of the research methods, suggest areas or topics for further research, particularly those that are intended to overcome the limitations of current research.

Acknowledgements: here you should thank the researcher for his/her support, if applicable.

Keywords: provide 3-5 keywords that will help the reader and research databases to identify the topic of your work.

JEL Classification: classify your research into the appropriate category. Details available here: https://www.aeaweb.org/econlit/jelCodes.php?view=jel

References (optional): Use the 7th edition of the APA for in-text citations and bibliography. Use of Mendeley or Zotero citation management software is recommended.
